## **Aims and objectives**

Life courses have undergone profound changes in recent decades. Transitions across the life cycle have become a matter of public and political discourse, social welfare policies and the subject of a growing body of research. Transition research now spans over various fields, including childhood, youth, and aging studies as well as family, employment or gender studies. It encompasses diverse disciplines such as anthropology, educational sciences, demography, economics, psychology, public policy, sociology and social work. This broad range of perspectives calls for reflexivity regarding the implications and consequences of studying transitions.

Transitions are situated. The perspective of Doing Transitions implies not only asking what transitions are and what they mean in individual life trajectories but also how they emerge and are constituted. This applies also to transition research which itself is a situated practice with particular conditions of scientific knowledge production and drawing on takenfor-granted assumptions in epistemic practices. Doing Transitions, therefore, aims to account for disciplinary, geographical, historical, theoretical, methodological and other dimensions of situatedness.

The conference is the final event of the research training group "Doing Transitions," which has contributed to empirical investigation and theoretical reflection on life course transitions since its beginning in 2017. We invite you to take a retrospective as well as forward-looking perspective to jointly craft a common 'legacy'. We want to bundle the vast empirical insights that have been gained from a Doing Transitions approach, discuss them with other transition researchers, and reflect on theoretical and methodological implications.
